

Enrolment Procedures

- The Year 11 2027 Enrolment Application can be found online via the College website - <u>www.crcs.vic.edu.au</u>. A step by step application guide is provided within your information pack;
- Please ensure all requested documentation and signatures are provided;
- Applications submitted by the deadline of Friday 13 February 2026 are \$250.00. Application fee for late submissions after this date is \$500.00;
- Enrolment offers will be emailed to families at end of May 2026.
- All students must complete Year 10 and have full endorsement by their current School Principal at the end of the year.



Priority will be given to:



- 1. Catholic children who are residents of a designated priority parish and have attended a priority parish Secondary School (Catholic Regional College Caroline Springs, North Keilor and St Albans);
- 2. Siblings of children already enrolled at Catholic Regional College Sydenham;
- 3. Catholic children who are residents of a designated priority parish and have not attended a Catholic Primary or Secondary school;
- 4. Catholic children from other parishes (for pastoral reasons);
- 5. Children from non-Catholic Eastern churches (i.e. Orthodox) who have attended a Catholic Primary or Secondary school and are residents of a priority parish;
- 6. Other Christian children who have attended a Catholic Primary or Secondary school and are residents of a priority parish;
- 7. Other Christian children who have not attended a Catholic Primary or Secondary school and are residents of a priority parish;
- 8. Non-Christian children who have attended a Catholic primary school and are residents of a priority parish; and
- 9. Non-Christian children who have not attended a Catholic primary school and are residents of a priority parish.



- The College is in the process of creating connections with elite sporting organisations.





LEARNING PATHWAYS

- * VCE is designed to give you entrance into the tertiary sector – ATAR (Australian Tertiary Admission Rank)
- * VCE VM is designed to provide students with a flexible study plan that leads to a Vocational pathway.
- * VET sits between these two pathways and can lend itself to both you can choose scored VET, which contributes to your VCE ATAR score, or choose an unscored VET for which the hours contribute towards your VCE or Vocational certificate.

VCE Vocational Major (VM)



Students study 16 to 20 units over two years Can include structured workplace learning

- Two-year vocational and applied learning program within the VCE for students in Year 11 and 12 at AQF level 2-3
- Replaces Senior and Intermediate VCAL
- Transition into apprenticeships, traineeships, further education and training, university (through alternate entry programs) or directly into employment

VET PROGRAMS

- * VET subjects offered are either Certificate II or Certificate III completed over a two-year period.
- * Students are expected to complete a number of Units of Competency (UOC) over a two-year period.
- * VET subjects are hands-on and have direct links to industry-based skills.
- * CRC Sydenham forms part of Brimbank VET Cluster (BVC)
- which gives us access to external VET subjects not offered at Sydenham.
- * Some VET subjects are unscored, and others are scored and can contribute to your ATAR score.
- * There are levies associated with all VET subjects internal VET subjects have a small levy whilst external VET subjects start at \$1800.
- * Some VET subject require their own uniform.


